IFDS welcomes faculty and administrators from community college through university level. Participants do not need to be experts on the seminar topic or region.

Funding

The TU International Programs Office will fund up to two faculty members to attend a CIEE International Seminar abroad in Summer 2010. Preference will be given to faculty members who have not previously participated in a CIEE seminar. Part-time faculty may apply. Upon return, the faculty member is expected to document the experience in a written report, present seminar information to departmental colleagues, and incorporate the material into new or existing courses.

Application Process

Interested faculty should submit a letter of intent (approximately 250 words) explaining how the international perspective gained from the seminar will translate into benefits for curriculum design, classroom teaching, research, or study abroad opportunities.
