On May 1st, the Inauguration marks the start of our Charting the Second Century. Some values that will help us chart the next century are serving our customers, collaboration, and competition. Conflict of Interest Policy. The policy has been written and revised with the help of Faculty Council. It applies to all employees. It has been given to the President's Council.

Capital Project Update. BA – The food court should be finished by the end of the semester. Enrollment Management has had to wait, but may have a May move in date. Business & Technology has run into several problems including more asbestos and a basement with a running spring. This has been an overrun of costs. Fine Arts is waiting to see how much of the 2005 Capital Bond money is available for the last project. Centennial Plaza, phase 2 parking area should finish in May. Phase 3 will add a sign and create an entry to campus. There could possibly be a water feature.

Budget Update. Oklahoma will have shortfalls for next year. There is a budget meeting Friday April 3rd with forms and details for account sponsors. There will be a 1 ½% reduction for all budgets.

Copier/Print Management Program. Every PC and printer on campus will be linked to a monitoring program that will make suggestions about where to print documents. Installation of the monitoring program will be done building by building and start with the highest usage area – Business & Technology. Copiers, PCs, desktop printers and networked printers will all be added to the network so everyone could print to the best printer for their project.

Retiree Health Insurance. For many years, a benefit to retired employees has been that the University pays employee health insurance until age 65. After July 1, new hires will not receive this benefit.

Making Work Pay. Next month employees should see an increase in their take home pay due to the "making work pay" tax credit. It should be \$47 for single and

\$67 for married according to the selection made on each W2. There will be an email to explain the tax credit.

Legislative Update. He has had over 60 meetings in Oklahoma City. He has presented projects concerning initiatives in the health sciences, STEM teaching and a graduate health care program. Legislators understand that there will be a health care crisis by 2012 and our programs can help with staffing. We are moving forward with an Allied Health Care program in Muskogee.

Building Renovations. Residence Halls are in the works. He and the Deans have been evaluating what ARRA will mean to Oklahoma. Don't believe anything you read about the issue. The act requires the state to fund higher education at 2006 levels with state funds in order to receive stimulus money.

ASCUE (?) meeting in DC. Most funds for education will come from the Dept. of Education. Deans have listed projects totaling 29 million dollars with 49 projects. We will also have projects that collaborate with other campuses and six allied health projects.
