In a single afternoon, students and their families can become familiar with college entrance requirements, learn about planning for college, and obtain on-site assistance in filling out financial aid application forms. In addition, valuable information will be shared about the benefits of attending college, student support services, areas of study, and different degree programs.

The College Goal Sunday SM program was created by the Indiana Student Financial Aid Association with funding from Lilly Endowment, Inc., and with supplemental support from Lumina Foundation for Education.

The U.S. Department of Education awarded Oklahoma with a state GEAR UP grant totaling \$20.5 million in August 1999. The grant has been matched by more than \$25 million from state and partner resources. With the addition of year six federal funding, Oklahoma's GEAR UP program has received approximately \$25 million in federal funds since 1999. GEAR UP receives 50 percent of total funding from the federal government and 50 percent from other organizations.
