Celebrating Martin Luther King Day

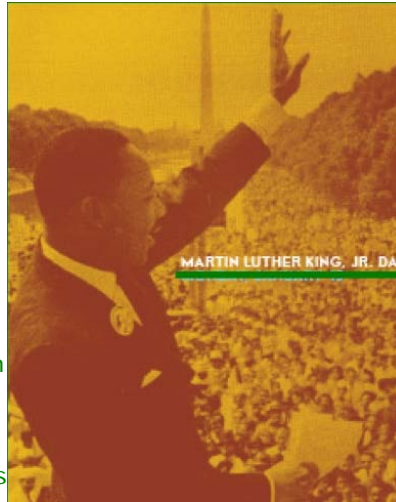
Due to ice days in January, the celebratory events planned to honor Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday have been moved to February 1, 2007.
