It's my pleasure to share some of these projects with you, including:

- Second Century Square, an outdoor gathering and performance space located between
- the University Center and the College of Business and Technology; Redmen Heritage Wall, honoring our university's sports legacy and located between Haskell Hall Annex and the John Vaughan Library;
 - Capitola "Cappi" Wadley Reading and Technology Center, being constructed on the third floor of the College of Education's Bagley Hall;
- Multipurpose Events Center for basketball games, concerts, and performances, as well as the only storm shelter in Cherokee County, to be built just south of the Doc Wadley
- Football Stadium; Health and Wellness Center, providing fitness, training, and health-related services to NSU students, employees, and the surrounding communities, to be built on the northwest corner of Oklahoma and Crafton; and
- Embrace the Vision Campaign for the Oklahoma College of Optometry, to fund a new Lesley L. Walls Low Vision Clinic on the NSU-Broken Arrow campus, upgraded surgery and advanced care clinics on the Tahlequah campus, endowed scholarships and faculty positions, an equipment replacement fund, and planning and design for new and
