Outreach at Northeastern State University-Muskogee consist of on campus hosted events and activities and off-campus collaborations. NSU-Muskogee opened its present campus in the spring of 1993 with the construction of the now Administration building. This construction was funded by a City of Muskogee sales tax. In the fall of 2001 the Mike Synar Center was added to the campus. This facility was built using both private donations and state monies to honor longtime US Congressman and Muskogee native, Mike Synar.

Because of the close relationship between NSU and the City of Muskogee, the Muskogee campus has hosted numerous community and regional conferences. Dr. Tim McElroy, campus Dean since 1999, and other staff members have embraced NSU-Muskogee's commitment to collaboration by serving on various boards and local committees.

For example, Dr. McElroy has served as chair and board member of the Eastern Oklahoma District Library System; president of the Muskogee Noon Lions Club; president of the Muskogee Area Educational Consortium; chair and board member for the Greater Muskogee Area Chamber of Commerce board of directors; board member of the local Salvation Army; board member for Habitat for Humanity of Muskogee; board member for Muskogee Development and board member for the Eastern Workforce Investment Board. He also serves on the local advisory council for Junior Achievement.
