Woman to Woman Lecture Wednesday, April 4, 2007

This year, the AAUW Woman To Woman Lecture is designed to help us learn about Middle Eastern Women. Dr. Mohja Kahf, an associate professor of Comparative Literature at the University of Arkansas, will present "Burgas,



Bras and Battlezones" at 2 p.m. in the first floor auditorium of the NET Building on the NSU campus. Put this on your calendar now so that you will come. Bring your friends to this informative presentation.

AAUW members are invited to have lunch with our speaker at 12 noon at Vidalia's Restaurant before the lecture. A reception provided by Sodexho will be held immediately following the program.

Dr. Kahf will be available to autograph her latest book, "The Girl in the Tangerine Scarf." In this novel, Khadra Shamy recalls growing up in an immigrant Syrian family in 1970s Indianapolis. Khadra's devout parents raise Khadra and her older brother, Eyad, to be observant of Islamic customs. This book and others which will be available for purchase after the program.

Born in Damascus, Syria, Dr. Mohja Kahf came to the United States as a child. She obtained her Ph. D. in Comparative Literature from Rutgers University in 1994. She is a faculty member in the U of A's <u>The King Fahd Center for Middle East and</u> <u>Islamic Studies</u> as well as in the <u>Program in</u> Comparative Literature.

Booklist describes her first poetry book, "Emails from Scheherazad," as "brilliantly wry and utterly irrestible. Kahf is an earthy, playful and purposeful poet who writes what it's like to be a woman, a person of color, an immigrant, and a headscarfwearing Muslim in a non-Muslim country."

Kahf's poetry has been published in literary

anthologies and journals. In 2002, she received an Arts Council Individual Artist grant for literary achievement. Her first book of literary scholarship was "Western Representations of the Muslim Woman: From Termagant to Odalisque."

AAUW/OK LEADERSHIP WORKSHOP

AAUW/OK will present "Continuing Our Legacy of Leadership" at the 2007 Leadership Workshop on Saturday, April 21st at the Tom Sneed Center on the Rose State College campus in Midwest City. This event begins at 8 a.m. with registration and will adjourn at 4 p.m. All members are invited and encouraged to attend. The cost for regis-tration, lunch and all handouts is \$20.00.

In the morning, the speaker will be Seth Chase, an AAUW field director who plans and manages grassroots advocacy on AAUW's public policy priorities including voter education, e-advocacy, and constituent lobbying to members of Congress. Prior to joining AAUW staff, Chase worked for the League of Women Voters Education Fund as the coordinator of DemocracyNet and coordinator for elections and civic engagement programs.

Mr. Chase will be making the following presentations: "AAUW Values, Principles and Power," will address what is currently happening and anticipated changed coming through bylawamendments to be presented at the AAUW National Convention in Phoenix in June. "A Tour Through the AAUW Website" will acquaint attendees with the wealth of information on the Member Services Database. "Woman-to-Woman Voter Turnout: Planning a Community-Based Campaign to Mobilize Women to Vote" and "Grassroots Advocacy Leadership Training" will help AAUW members focus on public policy issues and make a contribution to their communities.

During the luncheon, participants will have the opportunity to network with other state members who hold similar offices.

After lunch, Dr. Cindy Dougherty will lead an interactive workshop, *"How To Deal With Difficult People"*. What and WHO causes you stress? Difficult People? This workshop presents tried and true ways to rise above it ... figuratively and literally. You will walk away with usable tools for dealing with daily dolts ... and a smile on your face.

Dr. Dougherty is the Dean of Students at Southwestern Oklahoma State University where her office serves 5,500 students and supports 75 campus organizations. As a "Visiting Executive," she also teaches nonprofit management at the Tuck School of Business at Dartmouth College in New Hampshire. She has worked with many corporations, and nonprofit organizations. She holds bachelor's degrees in English, mass communications and secondary education from Phillips University and a master's degree in Journalism from the University of Oklahoma. She received an honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters from Eureka College. She previously served as dean, vice provost and vice president at Chapman University in Orange, California.

AAUW SCHOLARSHIP

It is time for scholarship applicants to get their applications submitted. The following rules apply:

The scholarship recipient must be a graduate woman pursuing a degree at Northeastern State University;

The amount of the scholarship is \$500, plus a one-year membership in AAUW, to be awarded in the fall semester;

The applicant may be enrolled either full-time or parttime;

The applicant must have a cumulative grade average as follows:

3.5 grade average in all graduate course work attempted. (If the applicant has no graduate course work, the undergraduate grade point average must be at least 3.0);

The recipient must maintain the required cumulative grade average through the spring semester after the award or the scholarship will be awarded to the alternate applicant;

Applications for this scholarship should be **POSTMARKED BY MARCH 26** with the scholarship being awarded for the following spring semester;

The applications will be reviewed by the AAUW Graduate Woman Scholarship Committee for recommendation to the AAUW Board for final approval;

The recipient will be invited to the August or September AAUW (Tahlequah Branch) meeting;

The recipient is encouraged to attend the AAUW meetings;

Scholarship money will be disbursed in early fall upon proof of enrollment; and
